Too many Christians today embrace new ideas on the basis of natural feeling and inclination. Then, with their mind made up, they go to the Bible seeking justification for their preconceived view. The Bible ought to be the Christian's only rule of faith and practice. Its truths are absolute, and should never be looked upon as merely a basis for discussion. We must first determine what the Scriptures teach, and then, holding that truth as not negotiable, see whether new ideas and technology agree or not.

In this booklet Dr. Wilson examines the issues of human life from a wholly Scriptural standpoint, and then, on that basis, scrutinizes many of the current medical advances and techniques to establish their morality or otherwise.
